DRAFT PROPOSED ASSOCIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE ENVIRONMENTAL AND ENGINEERING GEOPHYSICAL SOCIETY and THE SOCIETY OF EXPLORATION GEOPHYSICISTS OF JAPAN

In recognition of the mutual interests of their members, and to advance the common goals and objectives of each Society, the Environmental and Engineering Geophysical Society (EEGS) and the Society of Exploration Geophysicists of Japan (SEGJ) have agreed to the mutual association of the two Societies, under the following terms:

- 1. Neither Society shall have any financial obligation to the other.
- 2. EEGS shall be welcome to send representatives to participate in a non-voting capacity in the SEGJ Annual General Meeting. SEGJ representatives are welcome to attend the EEGS Business luncheon which is held each year during the SAGEEP conference.
- 3. The Business Officers of both Societies shall exchange announcements of technical meetings of their respective Societies.
- 4. The representatives of one Society attending the conference of the other Society, shall have an opportunity to display in the Exhibition Area of the conference to promote the activities and future conferences of the visiting Society at no charge, and shall be provided other courtesies of the host Society.
- 5. The two Societies shall exchange two copies of each issue of their respective journals and newsletters, one for the files of their business office and one for their respective editorial committees.
- 6. Neither Society will publish the papers presented at the technical meeting of the other Society, unless a specific approval is obtained from the other Society.
- 7. Either Society may publish reviews or abstracts of the papers published by the other Society after notifying the current editorial committee of the publishing Society, as a matter of courtesy.
- 8. Members of the Societies may purchase publications of the other Society, at the member prices of the publishing Society.
- 9. Other areas of cooperation, such as periodical discussions between the Executive Board of EEGS and the Board of the SEGJ, the holding of joint periodic workshops or the invitation of members as key-note or state-of-art speakers at the technical meeting of the respective Societies, shall be sought and considered, when feasible.
- 10. Members of each society can attend conferences of the other society at member's registration rate.
