ASSOCIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE KOREAN SOCIETY OF EXPLORATION GEOPHYSICISTS AND THE SOCIETY OF EXPLORATION GEOPHYSICISTS OF JAPAN

In recognition of mutual interests among their members, and as a means of furthering the common goals and objectives of each Society, the Executive Committees of the Korean Society of Exploration Geophysicists (KSEG) and the Society of Exploration Geophysicists of Japan (SEGJ) have agreed to mutual association of the two Societies under the following terms:

- 1. Neither Society shall have any financial obligation to the other.
- 2. No member sponsorship shall be required to the members of each Society applying for membership of the other.
- 3. Each Society shall invite the other to send an accredited representative to participate in a nonvoting capacity in its annual General meeting.
- 4. The Business Offices of both Societies shall exchange announcements of technical meetings of their respective Societies.
- 5. The members of each Society attending the meetings of the other Society, shall be applied the same registration fees as the host Society members and be provided other courtesies of the host Society.
- 6. The two Societies shall exchange two copies of each issue of their respective journals, one for the files of their business offices and one for their respective editorial committees.
- 7. Neither Society will publish the papers presented at the technical meeting of the other Society, unless otherwise a specific approval is obtained from the other Society.
- 8. Either Society may publish reviews or abstracts of the papers published by the other Society, after notifying the current editorial committee of the publishing Society, as a matter of courtesy.
- 9. Members of both Societies may purchase special publications of the other Society, at the member prices of the publishing Society.
- 10. Other areas of cooperation, such as to hold a joint periodical workshop or to invite each other as key-note or state-of-the-art speakers at the technical meeting of the respective Societies, shall be sought and considered, when feasible.
